The Difference Between Receiving Justice, Grace and Mercy from God

There are **four concepts** that we must keep in mind in order to better understand the way people—over the course of their life—experience God. They are the four categories, or concepts, or realities of **Justice**, **Non-Justice**, **Mercy** and **Grace**.

Justice:

Anything that you receive that you **do deserve** and that is **owed** to you

Justice is getting either:

The blessing that you do deserve

-- or --

> The punishment that you <u>do deserve</u>.

Justice therefore is always a <u>*righteous act*</u> on the part of God when He displays it.

Furthermore, **Justice** is **always** something that is **owed** to you.

vs.

Non-Justice

Anything that you receive that you **don't deserve** and that is <u>not</u> **owed** to you. There are **three types** of <u>Non-Justice</u>.

Injustice is either:

Not getting a blessing that you do deserve

-- or --

Getting a punishment that you don't deserve.

Injustice therefore is always an <u>evil act</u> and something which God simply *cannot* display.

Furthermore, **Injustice** is obviously **never** something that is **owed** to you.

Mercy is:

Not getting the punishment that you <u>do deserve</u>.

Mercy is always a <u>*righteous act*</u> on the part of God when He displays it.

Furthermore, **Mercy** is <u>a gift</u> and is <u>never</u> something that is <u>owed</u> to you.

Grace is:

Getting a blessing that you don't deserve.

Grace is always a <u>*righteous act*</u> on the part of God when He displays it.

Furthermore, **Grace** is **<u>a gift</u>** and is <u>never</u> something that is <u>owed</u> to you.

Between these two groups of people then ---those who receive **the just punishment** that <u>they do deserve</u> for their sins ... and those who instead receive mercy and grace that <u>they don't deserve</u> for their sins --between these two groups of people --- who gets **Injustice**? No one.

When God gives eternal punishment to sinners who have *never honored Him in their life* and who have repeatedly exchanged His glory for images of their own making and *worshiped their idols instead of Him* (in whatever form that sin has been displayed in their life) --- who gets justice as they are punished? *They* do --- and it is <u>a righteous</u> <u>display</u> of His glorious character as a God of justice when He gives this justice to them.

On the other hand, when God gives **eternal salvation** to sinners who have *never honored Him in their life* prior to that moment of their salvation and who prior to that moment have repeatedly **exchanged His glory for images of** *their own making* and *worshiped their idols instead of Him* --- who gets **mercy** and **grace** as they are saved? They do --- and this is <u>a</u> *righteous display* of His glorious character as a **God of mercy** and **grace** when He does so.
